1.1 HEADLINE

NHS England refreshed Green Plan guidance in February 2025, requiring all ICBs and Trusts to update their green plans. The ICB Green Plan 2025-30 published in July, highlights progress made between 2022 and 2025, and lays out our vision for the next 5 years.

1.2 REASONS TO CELEBRATE

 We are thrilled to announce that our Clinical lead for Environmental Sustainability, Dr Sarah Hopkins, was a finalist for the Health Innovation Northwest Coast Sustainability Award for developing an education programme for trainee GPs.

In Primary Care, 15%+ of our GP practices have introduced carbon reduction plans and 30% have a Green Lead. Are you one of the 42 LSC practices signed up to the RCGP <u>Green Impact for Health toolkit</u>? 32% of ICB staff have received the presentation 'Introduction to Sustainability'.

Sustainable Medicine

Have you introduced **Kidzmed**? This initiative supports children to use tablets instead of liquid medication. The Over-Wyre Medical Centre switched some of their children, from liquid omeprazole to tablets/granules. An initial trial resulted in annual cost savings of c£14k for just 3 patients!

1.4 HEADLINES FROM OUR TRUSTS



Funding for **LED lighting**: £6.46m of national funding will save Trusts an estimated £3.2m+ annually. Funding for **solar panels**: £7.75m of national funding will save Trusts an estimated £1m+ annually. Funding for **sub-metering**: £96k awarded to Morecombe Bay Hospital Trust. Funding for **EV charging infrastructure** awarded to NWAS, LSCFT and BTH totaling c£539k.

1.5 CHALLENGES & RISKS

- Government has paused public sector decarbonisation funding.
- Resource uncertainty during OneLSC and ICB restructure.

1.6 WHAT'S NEXT

- Space Utilisation: the ICB has a target to reach 85% utilisation of healthcare buildings across LSC. Efficiencies will be achieved by implementing a Terrier system (database to hold the details of all buildings) and Universal Booking System.
- Sustainability and social value will be fully integrated into the commissioning process the recent ICB report by PA Consulting includes recommendations around staff training and use of the Sustainability Impact Assessment.
