### TNM Clinical Classification

#### T – Primary Tumour

<b>cTX</b>	Primary tumour cannot be assessed
<b>cT0</b>	No evidence of primary tumour
<b>cTis</b>	Carcinoma in situ (Penile intraepithelial neoplasia – PeIN)
<b>cTa</b>	Non-invasive localised squamous cell carcinoma <sup>1</sup>
<b>cT1</b>	Tumour invades subepithelial connective tissue <sup>2</sup> <b>cT1a</b> - Tumour invades subepithelial connective tissue without lymphovascular invasion or perineural invasion and is not poorly differentiated <b>cT1b</b> - Tumour invades subepithelial connective tissue with lymphovascular invasion or perineural invasion or is poorly differentiated
<b>cT2</b>	Tumour invades corpus spongiosum with or without invasion of the urethra
<b>cT3</b>	Tumour invades corpus cavernosum with or without invasion of the urethra
<b>cT4</b>	Tumour invades other adjacent structures

<sup>1</sup> - Including verrucous carcinoma.

<sup>2</sup> - Glans: Tumour invades lamina propria, Foreskin: Tumour invades dermis, lamina propria or dartos fascia, Shaft: Tumour invades connective tissue between epidermis and corpora and regardless of location

<b>N – Regional Lymph Nodes</b>	
<b>cNX</b>	Regional lymph nodes cannot be assessed
<b>cN0</b>	No palpable or visibly enlarged inguinal lymph nodes
<b>cN1</b>	Palpable mobile unilateral inguinal lymph node
<b>cN2</b>	Palpable mobile multiple or bilateral inguinal lymph nodes
<b>cN3</b>	Fixed inguinal nodal mass <i>or</i> pelvic lymphadenopathy unilateral or bilateral

<b>M – Distant Metastasis</b>	
<b>cM0</b>	No distant metastasis
<b>cM1</b>	Distant metastasis present

<b>pTNM Pathological Classification</b>
<b>pT – Primary Tumour</b>
<i>The pT category corresponds to the cT category</i>

<b>pN – Regional Lymph Nodes</b>	
<i>The pN categories are based upon biopsy or surgical excision</i>	
<b>pNX</b>	Regional lymph nodes cannot be assessed
<b>pN0</b>	No regional lymph node metastasis
<b>pN1</b>	Metastasis in one or two inguinal lymph nodes
<b>pN2</b>	Metastasis in more than two unilateral inguinal nodes or bilateral inguinal lymph nodes
<b>pN3</b>	Metastasis in pelvic lymph node(s), unilateral or bilateral or extranodal extension of regional lymph node metastasis
