Executive summary

This paper presents an updated and published version of the ICB strategy for working in partnership with people and communities and a toolkit for staff across the ICB and NHS in Lancashire and South Cumbria for implementing the strategy.

In June, the members of the committee reviewed a revised ICB strategy for working in partnership with people and communities. The previous version of the strategy has been reviewed and learning from the development year has been considered. This updated version of the strategy builds on engagement and conversations with staff, partners and members of the public and recognises the importance of aligning engagement and involvement with the ICB's strategic priorities and the development of place-based partnerships which is where much of the engagement with local people will take place. The strategy also takes into consideration how this strategy will support the Integrated Care Strategy and the NHS Joint Forward Plan and support the delivery of the strategic priorities for the system.

Feedback from committee members was considered and in July the ICB Executive endorsed the updates to the strategy and this has been republished on the ICB website: <u>https://www.lancashireandsouthcumbria.icb.nhs.uk/get-involved/people-and-communities/lancashire-and-south-cumbria-strategy-working-people-and-communities</u>
