We believe that the voluntary community, faith and social enterprise (VCFSE) sector plays a critical role in tackling poverty and working with our communities. As the umbrella organization for the VCFSE sector, we strive to challenge oppression and prejudice, to promote diversity and to work towards a society where full equality of opportunities for all is a reality. Our passion drives us to strive towards ensuring the sector is visible, valued and heard. We understand how much work goes into improving the health and wellbeing of our communities and the current pandemic situation has highlighted this more than ever before - the importance of having a VCFSE sector that thrives.

This year we have helped groups to access funding opportunities, drive conversations around community development, health and wellbeing of our communities and support for our disadvantaged communities through our volunteer centre.

This year, we set up the Urgent Response Fund to help support groups helping to mitigate the impact of COVID. Working with local partners, including the NHS, the city and county councils, local businesses and the kind generosity from the public, we have supported groups with over £60,000 in funding to voluntary, community, faith, and social enterprise sector groups, to offer a quick, simple way of supporting individuals and communities in need. We also continue to support communities through our regular bulletins that provide information on funding opportunities, health and wellbeing activities, job opportunities volunteer services to organisations. In March 2020, in partnership with Hope Church, Lancaster Integrated Care Community & Lancaster City Council, we set up the Lancaster District Support Line. With the help of our amazing volunteers, we have helped over a couple of thousand people with shopping, medication, befriending and supporting families. As we head into Christmas and New Year, we know this period will be very difficult for many people. Many are experiencing grief from loss, loneliness and financial challenges.

We can still advertise and promote your roles in the usual sorts of ways - online, through social media, in our bulletin - but was can also send requests directly to over 800 registered people across the district and ask them to contact you directly should they be in a position to help. Many of these people have recent DBS certificates (issued within the last year or two), and DBS checks for COVID-19 related roles are being fast-tracked at the moment, should you need to get any done for your staff or volunteers.
