Key Decisions and Actions	Though membership for the Determinants of Health System Delivery Board is yet to be ratified it is clear that the Board is passionate in ensuring that the key people within the key organisations are involved in order for intended outcomes to be met. With this in mind, it is essential to have representation from each of the district councils, including those from children's health.
	A draft version of the Boards key metrics were circulated to Members prior to the meeting for review. Members heard that inspiration taken from Public Health England and the Kings Fund was adopted, as the metrics of which the Board would be looking to work upon, as these have already been thoroughly developed. The Board proposes to use 9 key impact areas that have been identified as having proved within systems to have improved public health and having reduced inequalities.
	Members received a presentation from Samantha Baron around a project that has been developed of which aims to create a clear vision for the Central Lancashire Integrated Care Partnership as to how the ICP will work together as public services to improve outcomes for the communities in Chorley, South Ribble and Preston. It will consider what an integrated approach would look like in a range of settings, from within our communities, to ensuring that people are living well and at points of access to services.
